





Dual Transformation:


Dual refers to two simultaneous transformations that reinforce each other, rather than a monolithic process of change.




At the simplest level, dual transformation involves:

- (a) finding ways to better service existing customers
- (b) while simultaneously finding ways to reach new customers outside core markets
- (c) then combining the leveraging of a company's valuable assets for new entrepreneurial ventures

- The church has no competition: There is no sports to watch, no fitness events to attend (weekend marathons, mud runs, bowling tournaments and so on), no youth sports leagues (soccer, softball, baseball, and so on) and no community gatherings, farmers markets, or town festivals, no recreational activities, Disney World, Movie Theaters, and even beaches are closed.
- "Viewers" does not necessarily equal "church visitors": Staying on a Facebook Live video for more than three seconds counts as a "view."
- Fewer churches to choose from: There are many smaller churches who are not having worship services.
- Digital church-hopping: Already-Christians visiting.



Keys to Reach New People in Digital Worship


- 1. Live, not pre-recorded
 - 2. Multiple streams
- 3. Dialogue not monologue
- 4. Team based (digital ministers)
 - 5. Sermonic conversation
- 6. Steve Jobs style (story, simple, unscripted)
 - 7. TED Talk Rule (18 mins tops)
 - 8. Change screen every 3-5 minutes
- 9. Invitational (multiple engagement points)

- 10. Capture visitor's contact
 - 11. Follow up with visitors
 - 12. Digital "home visits"
- 13. Redefine "membership"
- 14. Create opportunities for feedback (free SurveyMonkey)








Young folks are learning the value of old school acts of love: phone trees, care packages, or sending a letter by snail mail.




Summary: Cultivating a Digital Church

- 1. Form a team
- 2. Prayerfully listen in the digital ecosystem for "the need"
- 3. Identify a "person of peace" (Luke 10)
- 4. Create/use existing virtual space (Facebook, Zoom, YouTube, Streamyard, Website, etc.) make graphics, posters, logos
- 5. Spread the word, emails, event invites, Instagram, Twitter
- 6. Gather: just start, don't overthink it!
- 7. Evaluate: adjust as necessary, what worked or didn't, time, platform, leaders, and so on

Discipleship Covenant

Covenant: A relationship with clear boundaries.

God often offers relationships through covenants: Adamic Covenant Genesis 1:26-30; 2:16-17, Noahic Covenant Genesis 9:11, Abrahamic Covenant Genesis 12:1-3, Palestinian Covenant Deuteronomy 30:1-10, Mosaic Covenant Deuteronomy 11, Davidic Covenant 2 Samuel 7:8-16, New Covenant Jeremiah 31:31-34, Matthew 26:28, Hebrews 9:15. The new covenant is cut into the heart muscle, a blood bond between Jesus and his followers.

My desire in this relationship is to grow as an apprentice of Jesus. I am seeking to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind... and love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-40). I want to live a life ripe with the "fruits of the Spirt" "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control" (Gal. 5:22-23).

I will follow this process outlined in Scripture:

- 1. Surrender (to a covenantal apprentice relationship) "Follow me as I follow Christ" (1 Cor 11:1).
- 2. Inventory (examination of our souls) "carry your cross... who does not first sit down and estimate the cost" (Luke 14:25-32).
- 3. Confession (for full transparency and healing) "Confess your sins one to another and be healed" (James 5:16).
- 4. Amends (a guided process of righting wrongs) "If you remember your brother has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to your brother" (Matt 5:23-24).
- 5. Cultivating Christoformity (ongoing inventory, confession, spiritual practices, and check ins with discipler) "For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son" (Romans 8:29).
- 6. Disciple Others (take others through the journey) "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you" (Matt 28:18-20).

Wesley created a small-group system in which corresponding ministry constructs existed for each "wave of grace":

Prevenient Grace (Society): the only requirement for membership was "a desire to flee the wraith to come"


Justifying grace (Class): how goes it with your soul, wrestling with the implications of salvation and Jesus' claim of Lordship over our lives.


Sanctifying Grace (Band): How do we be holy as God is holy?

This system required an army of dedicated, spiritually mature laity to sustain the movement.



Learned Helplessness and the Artificial Ecosystem









Summary: Practical tools to make the shift

- 1. Using cheap to free technologies
- 2. Digital people mapping and prayer initiatives
- 3. Empower digital church teams and inherited church teams
- 4. From pulpit monologues to facilitating a sermonic conversation
- 5. Identify the need (discipleship resources, home school relief, isolation, fatigue, and so on... then meet it)
- 6. Rethinking membership (from "views" to "relationships")
- 7. Multiple giving streams

Summary Practical tools to make the shift

- 8. Website is the front door... answer it!
- 9. Also there are other doors (social media pages for each fresh expression and using Meetup)
- 10. Placefulness and real virtuality
- 11. Release the wolves, priesthood of all believers
- 12. Digital ministers (engage comments, offer prayer, join sermonic conversations, reach out to visitors)
- 13. 50/50 planner
